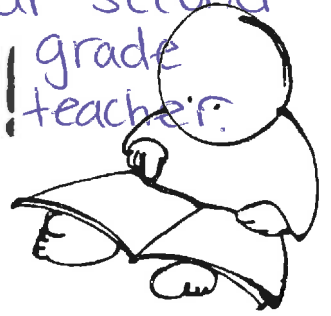

Dear Parents,

Please continue to practice sight word vocabulary over the summer in preparation for Second grade. It will help your child retain information taught throughout the school year. You will find an attached list of all WORDS TO KNOW-sight word vocabulary that were used with the JOURNEYS reading series.

To practice these words you can use flashcards, magnet letters, put words in sentences, etc. Anything to keep the words fresh in their minds! DAILY reading is SO IMPORTANT☺! Visit the library, find books on-line, use a Kindle, or find a fun way to display titles of books read over the summer. Attached is a Rising 2nd grade list of possible books your child may find helpful in choosing some summer reading.

READING SKILLS TO KEEP PRACTICING:

~COMPREHENSION: discuss the story with your child and ask questions...Who is the author/illustrator?, What is the title?, What is the setting, plot, problem, and how is the problem resolved?, Author's Purpose, compare & contrast the characters, Main idea and supporting details.

Your child should also write in a JOURNAL or notebook over the summer to document summer travels, experiences, and simply for the sake of writing. It will keep these skills consistent: mechanics, grammar, sequential order, and creativity!

~Counting by 1's, 2's, 5's, 10's 100's forwards and backwards

~Addition and Subtraction Facts: use the flashcards that your child will bring home

~Reciting the days of the week, months of the year, seasons of the year, yesterday/today/tomorrow (past, present, future), before and after, next and last

~Money: pennies, nickels, dimes, quarters, dollar bills

~Fractions: halves, thirds, fourths, sixths (parts of a whole - all parts are equal sized pieces)

~Time: Digital & Analogue Clocks - to the hour and half hour, hour & minute hand

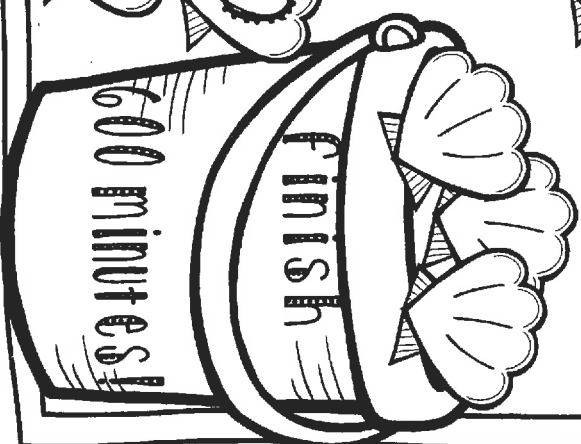

Color in a shell for every 20 minutes you read per day. Can you build a sand castle?



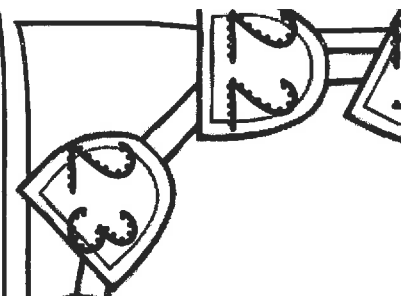
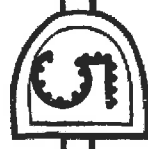
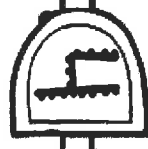
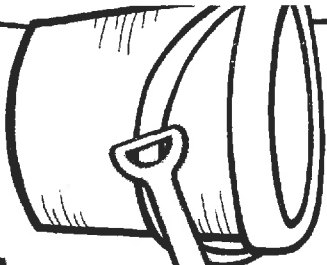

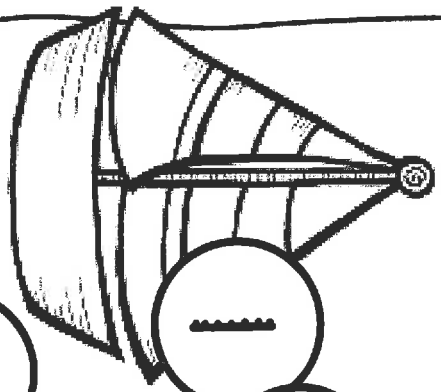
July Reading Log
