- 3. Click on the name of the subject you'd like to work on at the top of the page and navigate to your child's grade level.
- 4. Select a specific skill to practice from the list of skills. Please refer to your child's assignment tracker for the list of skills they need to work on.

If you notice your child struggling on an assigned skill, try having them practice the supporting skills which accompany that skill. You can use the Trouble Spots report and Question log to see how they are performing.

In addition to making practice more engaging, IXL is designed to help your child learn at his or her own pace. The program is adaptive and will adjust based on your child's demonstrated understanding of the material. All of your child's results are automatically saved, so they can practice from any device with an internet connection. For on-the-go practice, you can download IXL's free tablet apps for the iPad, Android, or Kindle and sign in with your child's username and password.
