Ramona's World by Beverly Cleary

Follows the adventures of nine-year-old Ramona at home with big sister Beezus and baby sister Roberta and at school in Mrs. Meacham's class.

Riding Freedom by Pam Munoz Ryan

A fictionalized account of Charley (Charlotte) Parkhurst who ran away from an orphanage, posed as a boy, moved to California, and fooled everyone by her appearance

Shiloh by Phyllis Reynolds Naylor

When he finds a lost beagle in the hills behind his West Virginia home, Marty tries to hide it from his family and the dog's real owner, a mean-spirited man known to shoot deer out of season and to mistreat his dogs.

Snow Treasure by Marie McSwigan

In the bleak winter of 1940. Nazi troops parachuted into Peter's village and held it captive. Nobody thought they could be defeated -- until Uncle Victor told Peter how the children of the village could fool the enemy. It meant risking their country's treasure -and their lives.

Stone Fox by John Gardiner

Willie hopes to win the prize in a dog sled race in order to pay the back taxes on his grandfather's farm.

Tough to Tackle by Matt Christopher

Assigned to play tackle instead of quarterback because of his size, Boots Raymond rebels and almost quits the team.

Windcatcher by Avi

While learning to sail during a visit to his grandmother's at the Connecticut shore, elevenyear-old Tony becomes excited about the rumors of sunken treasure in the area and starts following a couple who seem to be making a mysterious search for something.
