

## How to Access you Summer Assignment:

- 1. Go to https://www.IXL.com
- 2. Enter your username and password in the upper right corner and click the button to sign in.
- 3. From the home page, click on the "LEARNING" tab.



4. From the "Learning" tab, click on "SKILL PLANS."



5. From the Skill Plans, Select "IXL SUMMER BOOST: MATH" or "IXL SUMMER BOOST: LANGUAGE ARTS." Select 7<sup>th</sup> Grade.



 During the summer, complete each of the skills with a Smartscore of 80 or higher. If you already have a Smartscore for one of the sections, complete 10 practice problems to receive credit for the section.

# **SUMMER WORK RISING 7TH GRADE 2023**

You will all read the same two books this summer. The first combines a true story with science, world history, geology, sports and religion - Wowzers!

#### *All Thirteen The Incredible Cave Rescue of the Thai Boys' Soccer Team* by Christina Soontornvat

It's a physically beautiful book and an amazing story that will keep you turning the pages. And, I will admit to shedding a tear or two.

When you are finished, **you will write a Feature Story for** *The Washington Post* on the events. You may pick any aspect - the boys, the coach, the rescuers, the cave - to focus on. Start from the premise that your readers know a little bit about the story - it was in the news a ton, but now that you have all the information, you can highlight the human interest side of the story - make it interesting and give people new insights beyond the fact that a soccer team was trapped in a cave for two weeks.

In order to understand what a feature story is you will have to read a few - they usually appear at the bottom of the front page of a section of the newspaper or even the main story on the Style section of The Post. They give the reader a glimpse of the human side of the news.

Your story should be 2-3 pages typed, 12 point font, Time New Roman, double spaced. You may use quotes from the book - but they must be cited by page number.

## **BOOK TWO ASSIGNMENT ON BACK**

The second book is a really fun mystery that will keep you guessing and in suspense.

*And Then There Were None* by Agatha Christie. If you tell me next August 28th that you had it figured out before the end - I won't believe you. ;)

#### **Create a Google Slide Presentation that includes:**

- 1. Novel name and author (one slide)
- 2. An annotated passage for literary devices (metaphor, simile, personification, sensory imagery)
- 3. A character from the story give 3 adjectives to describe him/her and support with text evidence with page numbers(three slides one for each adjective)
- 4. 3 turning points in the story with page numbers Explain how the character or plot line changes at that point
